- 1 Norfolk Wildlife Trust Nature Reserve open year round 10am to 5pm. There is a small charge for entry; free for children and NWT members. The visitor centre is open April to September. Call 01692 598276 during season for further information. A wildlife trail by electric boat operates May to September.
- 2 Sutton Pottery is a small studio workshop established by Malcolm Flatman in 1977. He uses the Potter's Wheel and the fire of a gas kiln to create a large range of "reduction" stoneware entirely by hand. Usually open on weekdays (excluding Bank Holidays) 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. to 6 p.m. throughout the year.
- 3 Sutton Mill. The historic corn mill is Britain's tallest and was in use until 1940. It is now a museum, open every day except Saturdays, April to September.
- 4 St Mary's Church. Augustinian Priory recorded in the Domesday Book. The present church dates from AD 1240 and contains many ancient artefacts.
